Session Time: 1 Hour 30 minutes

Faculty Members: 2 Chairs; 4 Invited Speakers

Debates (DB)

Session Time: 45 minutes; includes a 10-Minute Rebuttal

Faculty Members: 1 Chair; 4 Invited Speakers (2 Protagonist; 2 Antagonist)

- · Spirited debate sessions on controversial issues.
- The Chair will give a five-minute introduction.
- There will be a 15-minute presentation from the Protagonist followed by a 15-minute presentation from the Antagonist, then a 10-minute rebuttal period (five minutes for each speaker).

Featured Symposia (SY)

Session Time: 1 Hour 30 minutes

Faculty Members: 2 Chairs; 4 Invited Speakers

- Showcase sessions surrounding a central theme with faculty known as experts in their subject area.
- Each invited speaker will receive 15-20 minutes of presentation time depending on the number of invited speakers; followed by a 30-minute question and answer session.

How-To Sessions (HT)

Session Time: 1 Hour 30 minutes

Faculty Members: 2 Chairs; 4 Invited Speakers

- Didactic sessions for heart rhythm practitioners looking for expert advice on how to perform procedures.
- Each invited speaker will receive 20-25 minutes of presentation time depending on the number of invited speakers; followed by a five-minute question and answer session.

Hyde Park (HP)

Session Time: 15 minutes **Faculty Members:** 1 Chair

- Each invited speaker will receive 15-20 minutes of presentation time depending on the number of invited speakers; followed by a 5-10 minute question and answer session.
- Sessions offered on Wednesday ONLY.

Pioneers Unplugged (PU)

Session Time: 1 Hour

Faculty Members: 1 Chair; 4 Invited Speakers

- Expert talks will be held in EPicenter located in Exhibit Hall D, covering various areas of expertise.
- Each expert will receive 15 20 minutes of presentation time without the use of audiovisual aids (i.e.PowerPoint presentation).

Rapid Fire Cases (RF)

Session Time: 1 Hour 30 minutes

Faculty Members: 1 Chair; 6 Invited Speakers (4-6 Cases; 3 Panelist)

- Case-based learning session featuring an expert panel.
- Experts will rapidly evaluate each case and discuss potential treatment options in five minutes followed by a 10-minute expert panel discussion.

Special Sessions (SP)

Session Time: 3 Hours (2 hours allotted for presentation; 30-minute Q & A; 30-minute break)

Faculty Members: 1 Chairs; 4-6 Invited Speakers

- Three-hour didactic teaching courses on "Hot and New" topics.
- The Scientific Sessions Program Committee will provide presentation titles for invited speakers
- Each invited speaker will receive 15-30 minutes of presentation time depending on the number of invited speakers; followed by a 30-minute question and answer session.
- Attendees must indicate their interest in the sessions offered on Wednesday <u>only</u> at the time of registration.

Translational Electrophysiology (TE)

Session Time: 1 hour 30 minutes

Faculty Members: 1 Translator; 4 Invited Speakers

- The session format allows clinicians and scientists to come together with the assistance of a carefully selected expert "Translator" presiding over the session.
- The Translator will give a five-minute introduction. In addition, the Translator will ask
 questions during each presentation, as well as moderate a 10-minute discussion with
 attendees after all presentations.
- Each invited speaker will receive 20–25 minutes total presentation time depending on the number of invited speakers in the session.
