Debate 3: In the era of laparoscopic surgery the only place for vaginal hysterectomy is the medical history books

The national and international statistics suggest that vaginal approach to hysterectomy is declining. This is despite the fact that evidence based guidelines and opinion leaders recommend vaginal hysterectomy as the preferred method of hysterectomy.
